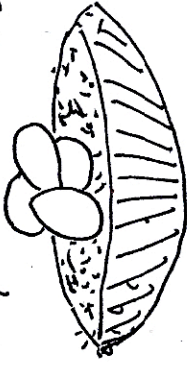


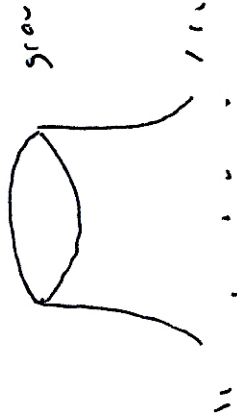
Birds usually

to it's place.

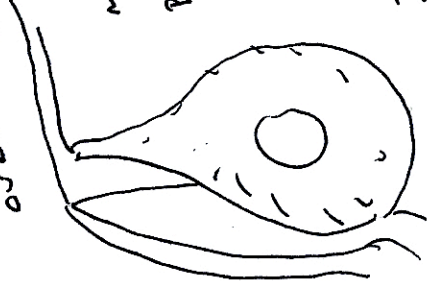
Peregrine falcons

than building nests.

Flamingos  
build nests  
from mud,  
on the  
ground.



Black-chinned  
hummingbirds  
build cup nests  
of plant down  
covered from  
spiders.

Orioles weave an  
owl bag nest



made from  
plants and  
lined with  
horsehairs  
or moss.

It hangs  
from trees.

Mallard ducks build  
simple scrape nests  
on the ground.



They do this in  
tall grass near ponds  
and lakes.
